CEO REPORT

2022 is flying by at an amazing rate and we are now already over half way through the year. We have welcomed the lovely rain over the past few months and hope that it continues for our farmers and gardeners. The cold weather has certainly set in over the last few weeks, but thankfully the new carpet in our Edwards hallways combined with reverse cycle airconditioning installed early 2021, ensures we no longer have to contend with the cold temperatures experienced in those areas of the facility in the past.

There are still many changes rolling out across the Aged Care Industry as a result of the Royal Commission findings, with the level of reporting to the federal government continuing to increase across many areas of the facility. In addition to the current quarterly reporting on the amount we are spending on food and catering wages, the department now require this reporting to be split even further into food purchases that include GST and food purchases excluding GST, so they are able to determine whether providers are cooking fresh meals with ingredients that do not include GST such as meat, vegetables, fruit, bread, milk etc. or buying pre prepared foods that attract GST. In addition we also need to report the amount spent per quarter on dental care including toothbrushes, toothpaste etc, and on nutritional supplements. At Riverview we pride ourselves on preparing our meals daily onsite, from fresh local ingredients purchased from local suppliers including Hygienic Meats, The Country Bakehouse, Glenview Eggs, Orchard Crush and Riverland Wholesale Fruit and Veg.

From the 1st of July, Aged Care providers are also required to report full financial reports including detailed profit and loss and balance sheet to the Department quarterly, included with this report we will also need to report the number of care minutes per day per resident broken down into Personal Care Attendant staff, Enrolled Nurses, Registered Nurses and Care Management minutes, reported on a per shift basis.

The Department will also be introducing a new Residential Aged Care provider star rating system, where providers will be star rated based on their reported care minutes per day, the results of interviews with residents/ representatives (interviews for Riverview residents/representatives have not yet taken place - our understanding is the Department will give a week or two notice then attend Riverview to speak directly with a random selection of residents/representatives), and provider accreditation and compliance records. The ratings will then be available on the Departments website, we are led to believe the ratings may be published towards the end of 2022.

At Riverview we pride ourselves in providing the best possible care and services. If you have any concerns please do not hesitate to let us know. It's also good to hear if there is something we are doing well, or if there is a particular staff member that has gone above and beyond in their deliver of care and/or services.

DON REPORT

Hello to all residents, families and staff,

Well winter is here, so it is important that we keep your loved ones warm, I would encourage all families to go through your loved ones cupboards and check their winter clothing to make sure that it is suitable and still fits. If you purchase new clothes make sure they are dropped off to the Reception desk for them to be labelled for the resident to use as soon as possible.

Update on what the Clinical Team have been up to in the last 3 months

- Clinical Governance We collect, audit and report monthly on all resident's incidents, infections, weight loss or gains, medication errors, wounds and skin conditions, behaviours and restrictive practises (quarterly). An investigation and interventions are commenced to help reduce the risk of the above occurring again. The Clinical team then audit and analyse each incident, infection, weight loss, wound then review systemically for trends, interventions and implement/evaluate continuous improvement to reduce the risk of incidents, wounds or infections form occurring at Riverview.
- Mandatory Quality Indicator Program is Due this month, the clinical team collect and report data quarterly across the five quality indicators:
 - Pressure injuries
 - Physical restraints
 - Unplanned weight loss
 - Falls and major injury
 - Medication management.Polypharmacy
 - antipsychotic medications
- The Riverview team would like to congratulate *Emma* in the new role of Quality Coordinator, she will continue to reinforce infection prevention and control practices as the IPC Lead.
- We would also like to welcome Onyi to the Clinical Management Team in the role of Care Plan Coordinator. Onyi has been working hard and learning how to complete Resident focused care plans reviews. If you have any question on your care or your loved ones care, please feel free to make an appointment with Onyi. Welcome Onyi.

Reminders from the Director of Nursing (Winter)

- The COVID-19 pandemic is not over, and this winter presents ongoing challenges to protect our residents, families, and our employees. Precautionary measures are still being prioritised, staff are wearing N95 masks and goggles and are up-to-date with vaccination for both COVID-19 and influenza. Our residents have been offered their 4th dose of COVID-19 vaccination and 2022 influenza vaccination. This will help reduces the risk of severe illness, hospitalisation and even death.
- Face *masks* are an additional physical barrier to help stop the spread of COVID-19. Under the Direction, all visitors are required to wear a face mask (covering mouth and nose) at all times while in the physical presence of others onsite. This includes while in the resident's room.
