News from our CEO

From our beginnings right back in 1964 when the foundation stone of Riverview Lutheran Rest Home Inc was laid by the Vice-President of the Lutheran Church of Australia SA District and a former pastor of the St Peters congregation Pastor H Stiller in front of a crowd of over 400 people. Then followed by the official opening by the Premier of South Australia Sir Thomas Playford, and dedication of the new 28 room facility by the President of the UELCA SA District Rev CJ Pfitzner in 1965, Riverview continues to be well patronised by residents, who call Riverview their home, well supported, by members of the community who give generously both of their time and resources, and a very special part of the lives of the now 100+ staff that work at Riverview, cooking, cleaning, serving, mowing, fixing, washing, caring, nursing, entertaining and generally spending a large amount of their lives here at Riverview assisting and interacting with our residents on a daily basis.

We are very blessed that Mr Alwin Waldemar Traeger and Mr Ernst Konrad Kaesler had the foresight to purchase the land upon which Riverview sits today with the view of setting up a low care Home for the Aged in Loxton. They were the catalyst for creating the wonderful caring community we still enjoy here today at Riverview.

The concept of Aged Care has changed considerably over this time. When the facility was first opened many residents had their own cars and came to Riverview to live in a community environment, often helping prepare meals and attend to daily chores. A very different aged care world to the regulated environment in which we now operate. Nowadays the Government has introduced home care packages that enable the elderly to stay at home much longer than was ever possible back in 1964, and now people generally call Riverview their home much later in life, often after having lived at home by themselves or with loved ones assisting them for some time.

Back in 1964 Rest Homes were generally a place for older people to live, today Riverview Lutheran Rest Home is so much more than that, we are a community in which residents and staff share their daily lives, there are many activities to choose from during the day, and we also enjoy getting out and about in the community. We value the many hours and gifts of our volunteers and treasure the visits from the Lutheran School children across the road. We are so much more than just an "Aged Care Facility", we are a community that is a special part of the daily lives of so many people; our residents, our families, our staff, our volunteers and our visitors. Thank you for the special role you all play in making Riverview the special place that it is today.

News from our DON

Hello everybody,

I hope you are all keeping well as we start to enjoy this beautiful Spring weather.

Firstly, I would like to welcome all our new residents to Riverview Rest Home, those who are permanent and those who are just here for some respite. We aim to make your time here enjoyable, happy and relaxing. In order for us to ensure we are providing an environment and care to the highest standard, we possible are currently conducting a resident survey, that with your help, or the help of your loved ones, we can gather your feedback about how you are experiencing your time with us. Once this information is collated, we can then plan our future direction and improvements to enhance your current living environment, entertainment and care. Please take the time to complete this survey if you haven't already done so and thankyou to those who already have.

Now for just a few reminders:

As the weather is improving, so could your Vitamin D levels if you go out and get some sunshine. All it takes is 3 minutes a day to improve your Vitamin D intake which is important for those aging bones, and also to help ward off depression as it is good for your brain. I haven't seen too many people outside over the last few weeks, so if it's a nice day, ask a staff member to help you to sit outside for a bit, but don't forget the sun block if you are going to be out there for a longer period. A reminder of what to do if the fire alarm goes off, if you are a visitor, resident or volunteer, please stay where you are if safe to do so, a staff member will come and get you if necessary and direct you to where you need to go. As bush fire season approaches, it is more important than ever to ensure that if you sign out and back in when you are a resident going on social leave, and that visitors and volunteers sign in and out, so we have an up to date list of who is in the building at all times. Sign in sheets are located in both front entrances. If you are entering through side doors, please ensure you still sign in and out at reception for this reason.

That's all from me for now. I will include results of the resident satisfaction survey in the next issue of the newsletter.
