News from our CEO

As a reminder to all staff, residents, board members, volunteers and visitors, we now have these displayed in both of our facility main entrances and have also placed them in our meeting room, and training room/board room, as a reminder to staff that all decisions and actions should align with our values and contribute to achievement of our organisations mission and vision.

As we strive to achieve our vision through the provision of quality care and services, we always value feedback, both positive and negative, so if there is something you think we do well, please let us know so that we keep doing it, alternatively if there is something you think we should do differently we welcome your input. You can either speak to someone here at Riverview, fill out a form and drop it in one of our secure suggestion boxes, provide feedback through our website, or send us an email.

The new accreditation standards come into effect from the 1st July 2019. You will see some posters around the facility that outline the new standards, Consumer Dignity and Choice, is at the heart of the new standards, with all other standards embracing this new standard one. We have commenced educating our staff on what the new standards are about, with staff information sessions held recently.

In the coming months we will be revising organisational policies and procedures to reflect the new standards, followed by further training for our staff, so that we are up and running under the new Aged Care Quality Standards by 1 July 2019.

The Lutheran Church of Australia has been undertaking a national Governance review that commenced in 2017. The review aims to strengthen the Governance of Lutheran Aged Care facilities across Australia and enable Lutheran providers to network and assist each other in navigating the highly regulated Aged Care World. Chairman and CEO's from approx. 25 Lutheran Aged Care facilities have been involved in the project since inception, our Chairman Robert Fielke and myself will be attending the 3rd gathering of this group early April. As a result of this project, the Lutheran Church of Australia has created a Governance Enhancement Co-ordinator, who has been of great assistance in enabling Lutheran Aged Care facilities to share information and avoid reinventing the wheel.

I hope you all have a restful and peaceful Easter, and that you find time to catch up with and enjoy your family and friends over the break.

RIVERVIEW COMMUNITY NOTES:

The importance of labelling EVERYTHING

Have you lost your glasses? We currently have 8 pairs in the office that have built up over a number of years, none of which are labelled. If you would like to look through this box, please speak to the Nurse in your section e.g. Traeger or Edwards. And request them to be labelled.

We ENGRAVE items for FREE, just bring them to office.

Clothing is at a cost of \$50 FOR LIFE. Our new labelling machine can wash our HOT WASHES and makes it easy for staff to identify who's items are who's.

Having EVERYTHING labelled, Clothes, hearing aids, glasses, electrical equipment, shoes, Blankets and rugs, makes it easier for staff to find their owners, if you are missing items of clothing, please check the lost property at the alternative entrance (staff can assist if required.) and request for items to be labelled if they are yours.

Clothing labelled with permanent marker are requested to have the new heat proof labels, as they will wash off.

Residents lost property is located in the new cupboards at the alternate entrance.

Please look for your loved one's items and arrange for labelling with office staff if required.

Bringing Food in to Riverview:

In accordance with the Riverview Food Safety Plan, we accept no responsibility for food items supplied directly to residents by friends or family members and these food items can neither be processed, handled nor distributed by any Riverview staff member (with the exception of supplying required utensils to enable their consumption if so required).

REMINDER ABOUT PHONES, INTERNET and OTHER TECH

Telephone and internet connections are the responsibility of the Resident (and or their family member or delegate)

This allows the freedom of choice between telco providers and accounts to be placed in the bill payers name.

Representatives do not have to be available for Telco appointments however, as staff are onsite 24/7 and can direct technicians to Residents rooms, switch boards and the like.

We do ask however, that we are notified of impending appointments to give staff the 'heads up' of who to expect and which Resident is due for an install.

Riverview staff are unable to assist with installation of equipment such as phones (mobile or landline), computers or other devices. (iPad, tablets and laptops, MP3 players. This would be the 'delegates' responsibility as would any training, subscriptions, log ins, payments or access issues.

We do have many tech savvy businesses locally who are able to visit here at Riverview, but these would need to be booked and paid by a 'delegate' if required.

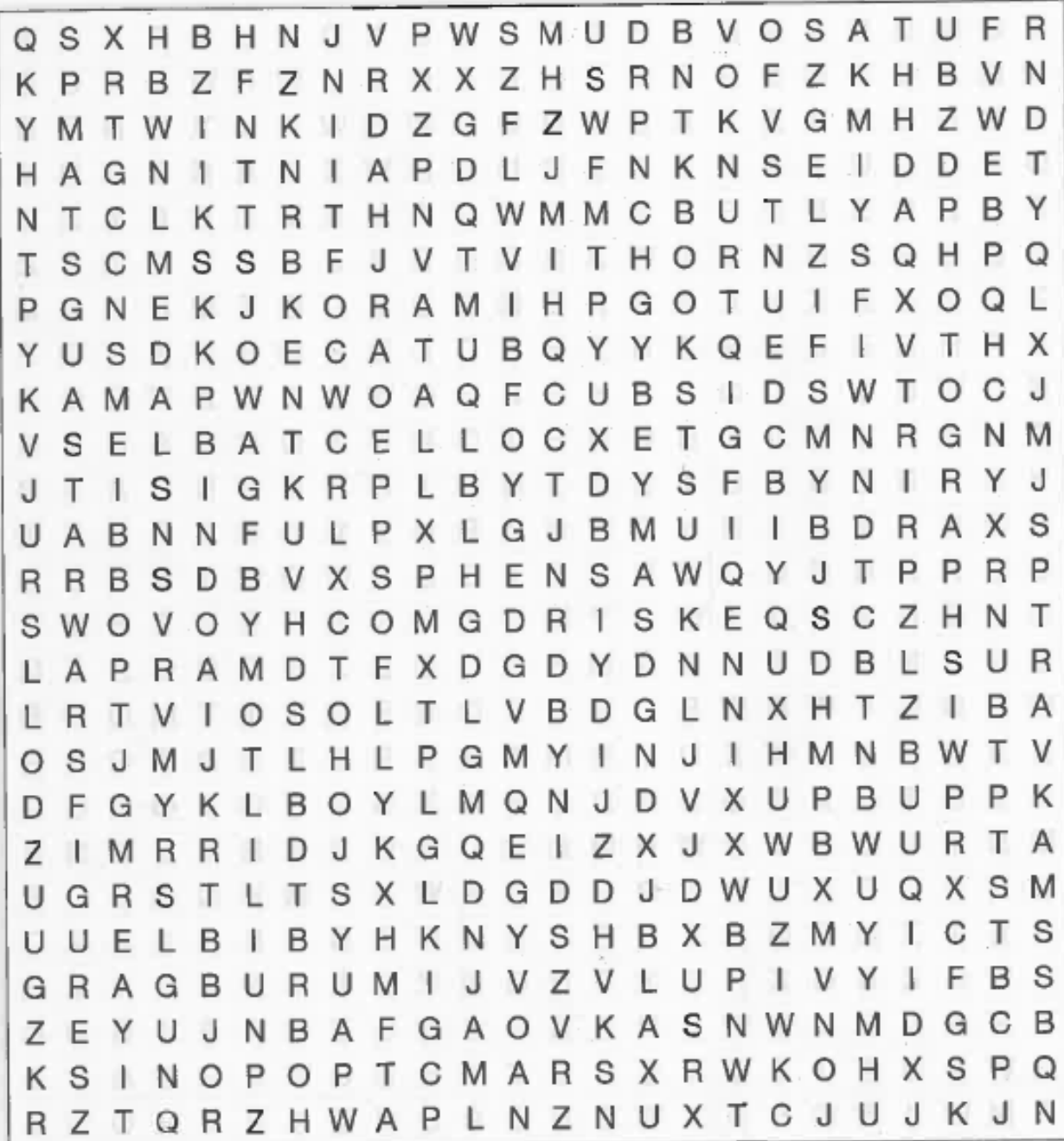
Any new electrical equipment that is brought into the home, e.g. Alexa, modems, power boards, electric lift chairs, TV's etc must be tagged tested.

This can be completed onsite by our Maintenance Team. And usually completed within 5 business days.
