Customs and traditions associated with Lent.

Most of us will know something about Ash Wednesday, the day on which we mark 40 days (not including the Lord's days; Sundays) to Easter. We call these days Lent. When we notice '40' days, we are reminded of the wilderness wandering of God's people for 40 years before entering the promised land and of Jesus' temptation in the desert for 40 days after his baptism, fasting, praying, and being tempted by Satan....And we consider our own wanderings in the deserts of our own sin.

On Ash Wednesday we have ashes placed on us in the shape of the cross. We did that this year at our weekly Riverview chapel service. We heard "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return." as we received those ashes. Stark words! The ashes and the words reminded us of our frailty before God because of our sin... He is an all consuming fire. And it reminded us of our promise and hope in Jesus cross for us. Later, questions were asked about why some had that dirty ash mark on our heads; they gave a witness!

Sometimes fasting is observed as a symbol of self denial in Lent and this has been extended to a period of abstinence from luxuries such as chocolate or wine or even Facebook, supposedly reminding us of Jesus self-denial for us.

But what about the day before, Shrove Tuesday, Pancake day? What is it about, and where does it come from? Because Lent was traditionally a time of fasting, Anglo-Saxon Christians went to confession and were "shriven" (absolved from their sins). A bell would be rung to call people to confession. This came to be called the "Pancake Bell" because it was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the Lenten fast and pancakes were the perfect way of using up these ingredients! But much of this has been long forgotten by those who tuck into pancakes for the sheer joy of the feast alone!

From the CEO

It was great to see our residents, staff and volunteers representing Riverview on our float in the Loxton Mardi Gras Parade last Saturday morning. Here at Riverview we believe it is very important to assist our residents to remain out and about and active in the community. Residents had a great time waving to the crowds that lined the main street, and staff had fun dressing up and showing the crowds the types of games and activities, our residents play at Riverview. A big thankyou also to our volunteers who assisted on the day. Well done to all involved.

Work on our new Chapel and Wellbeing centre is progressing. The old veranda and external concrete have been removed, earthworks for our 2 new rooms have been completed, next up is the footings and foundations. You are welcome to enter our existing Chapel and look out the window at what's happening, alternatively the end of the corridor in Edwards on the right side of our current building also has a nice big window and is a great place to check out what's going on. We are currently working with our cabinet makers on the design of cabinetry for our new rooms and kitchenette. kitchenette will be located in front of the new Chapel and Wellbeing centre, opposite a small private lounge, enabling families and visitors to help themselves to tea and coffee whilst they relax with residents in this area.

Following board ratification of our Clinical Governance Framework as discussed in the last newsletter, our management team and board clinical governance subcommittee have been busy reviewing our Organisational Clinical Risk Management register. involves identifying potential high-risk high prevalence clinical matters and ensuring we have appropriate policies, procedures and audits in place to minimise the occurrence of these things and reduce the risk of injury or complications. We are then required to audit and review what has happened to ensure what is in place is working, and to also identify areas for improvement and implement change.

We also monitor all incidents, resident clinical incidents and staff workplace incidents, review each of them, look at the action taken, was it successful? look what we have in place to prevent/reduce such incidents, is it working? What do we need to change? Is what we have previously changed working? This information is collated and examined monthly at Clinical Management meetings; these reports then go to our Organisational Risk Management meeting and the Board Clinical Governance sub-committee members for further review and are then also tabled at board meetings. This ensures clinical transparency across the organisation from the floor to the board as required under the new Aged Care Standards.

In other Governance news, a big thankyou to outgoing board member Anne Battams, who served on the Riverview board for nearly 10 years, Anne has held the roles of Chairman of the Capital Works and Maintenance subcommittee and also Vice Chairman, for much of this time. Anne will continue to volunteer by playing the piano for our very popular 'Melody sing-a-long with Anne' lifestyle activity each Thursday afternoon. Anne's contribution to the board has been significant and greatly valued and appreciated.

At Riverview we pride ourselves on delivering the best possible care and services, we really appreciate your feedback.
