#### **CEO Report**

Well Winter has certainly arrived! The lower temperatures at night, the foggy mornings and then just to trick us, out of the blue we had that terrible dust storm roll across South Australia late in May, and here in Loxton we certainly experienced our fair share of it! Sadly, we have not seen much rain that we all need so badly, particularly our farmers who are watching the skies daily, hoping for it to arrive.

I have been fortunate to be back at Riverview and covering for our CEO Nicolle, who is enjoying some well-deserved leave. Nicolle will be back on-board mid June and we will all be continuing

focussing with the task of transitioning Riverview across to the new Strengthened Aged Care Standards that sit within the new Aged Care Act. As many of you would recall from previous newsletters the new Standards were scheduled to start July 1<sup>st</sup> 2025.

In a surprise, but welcome news release, the new Minister for Aged Care and Seniors, The Honourable Sam RAE MP has announced that the Government has decided to briefly defer the start of the new Act until 1<sup>st</sup> November 2025. The Government has acknowledged in this deferral that it will allow and provide the time that providers should have been given to prepare for what the Government describes as 'a once in a generation aged care reform'.

At Riverview we are always striving for continuous improvement and your feedback and ideas, complaints and suggestions are taken on board seriously as we strive to make our residents, our families, staff and community a happy one.

In the kitchen, Head Chef Greg and his team of Cooks are learning and perfecting the moulding techniques for more appealing, whilst still remaining tasty and nutritious, texture modified food. Making meals look like the 'real deal' after they have been modified by texturizing, is a bit of an art, and Greg and his team of Cooks, have been practising these skills and coming up with some great looking and tasting textured meals.

We regularly receive positive feedback from residents at our resident meetings about our meals and many residents or their families will chat with Greg in the kitchen if they have a yearning for something special or have a suggestion to offer. We are fortunate that our Head Chef Greg, is very flexible, loves to make people happy, very open to discussion and always willing to cook up something different for any of our residents.

Meals are such an important part of the day, so don't ever forget that we welcome your feedback, your complaints and your suggestions in regard to meals (and anything else for that matter).

You can complete a form (available in both the Edwards and Traeger dining rooms) to provide us with your feedback, suggestion or complaint, ask a staff member to write it down for you, speak to the supervisor of the department of concern, ie for meals it is Head Chef Greg, for cleaning or laundry you can ask to speak to Jan our General Services Manager, for clinical care you can speak to any of the Nurses, and so on. So please, at anytime you have a question or a concern, ask any of the staff to direct you to the right person if you are not sure who to talk to, as someone will always follow up with you.
