



CEO Report

Only 2 months until Christmas, in fact only just over 1 month really until Loxton lights up and the festivities begin here at Riverview. The year is flying and so is the time before the commencement of the New Aged Care Act, which now comes into effect from the 1st of November.

The Government has only recently finalised the rules that underpin the new legislation, and aged care providers right across Australia are still working towards having all the new training and paperwork in place for its commencement, as we continue to have guidance material released by the Department.

For residents, there is a new legally binding statement of rights, that outline what residents can expect, replacing the old voluntary charter. Aged care providers will have stricter government reporting requirements, and more detailed performance data will be publicly available. A registered supporter can be appointed by a resident to help residents make decisions, (that is help make decisions, not make decisions for them) and there is strengthened legal Whistleblower protections for workers and residents who speak up if something is not right.

There are also several funding changes, but these will generally not affect existing residents. Existing residents who have paid refundable accommodation deposits will not be subject to the new retention rules that will apply to those entering aged care from the 1st of November.

The planning for our new 22 bed extension is progressing well with Development Application due to be submitted this month. Works are anticipated to commence in April 2026, with completion expected by the end of March 2027. Our residents had a sneak peek at the artists impression exterior look and feel of the new building at a recent residents meeting. The view from the common living area overlooking the river and Katarapko Island will be spectacular. Once plans have been finalised, we will have the plans and the artists impression photos printed on corflute and on display for residents and visitors to see.

We continue to explore what is new and best practice across the aged care industry and are very pleased to be implementing CareWindow across our home in all resident rooms, CareWindow is a purpose-built communication and engagement tool designed to seamlessly connect aged care residents with their families, support staff, and the broader care community. More than just a video calling device, it fosters a sense of connection, reduces social isolation, and brings peace of mind to families. Our new Pool table/air hockey/table tennis table has finally arrived and has been installed and is being enjoyed by many of our residents (and staff)!

As always, we strive to provide the best possible care and services, if you have any concerns or feedback, either good or bad, please don't hesitate to let us know so that we can improve on the things we could do better and keep doing the things you think we do well.

Staying Connected To Your Loved Ones

We are pleased to share that we will soon be introducing CareWindow technology in our residents' rooms. This initiative is part of our ongoing commitment to enhancing the quality of care, communication, and connection for our residents and their loved ones.

What is CareWindow?

CareWindow, is an iPad-sized video calling device designed for those with cognitive and mobility issues. It also doubles as a digital photo frame and dementia-friendly clock, with clear familiar display for comfort and ease. CareWindow is an easy-to-use technology platform that allows residents and families to stay more connected. It provides opportunities for video calls, sharing updates, photos, and information, as well as offering an additional way for staff to support residents in maintaining meaningful connections with family and friends. Please note that there may be occasions when video calls are unavailable due to privacy requirements, high-care situations, or operational reasons. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation during these times.

What this means for residents and families:

- Residents will have access to CareWindow directly in their rooms.
- Families can connect with their loved ones through the system in a simple and secure way.
- Our staff will provide support to ensure residents are comfortable using the technology.

Next steps:

We will begin rolling out CareWindow over the coming weeks, starting with installation in resident rooms. Staff will be available to assist residents and families in getting started and answering any questions you may have.

We believe this technology will bring great benefits by strengthening communication and supporting the wellbeing of our residents.

All you will need to do is download the CareWindow app and scan the QR code on the front of the CareWindow, if you are unable to visit your loved one in person, please contact us and we will provide you with a link to set up access.

Thank you for your continued support as we work together to make life at Riverview Lutheran Rest Home as engaging, connected, and comfortable as possible.

We encourage open communication between staff and families regarding the use of CareWindow, and we welcome your feedback to help us enhance the experience for all involved.
