2025 has been another busy year here at Riverview the commencement of the New Aged Care Act has kept us very busy administratively and has involved additional training for all of our staff, we have also rolled out Care Window, purchased additional King Single Beds, taken delivery of the new pool/air hocky/table tennis table, installed 5x hi tech mattresses for best practice pressure area care for immobile residents, introduced moulded food for texture modified diets, added another recumbent bike to our gym and have been working closely with architects Brown Falconer on finalising the plans and design for our new 22 bed extension.

Many of our staff have also attended conferences and offsite education to keep up to date with best practice and find the latest and greatest equipment and technology to improve the day to day life of our residents and create efficiencies for our staff.

Residents, staff and our Board have all had a sneak peak at the plans and artists impressions of our new extension. Once Development Approval is obtained these will be printed and placed in the home for general viewing. The new living area will be spacious and have wonderful views of the Murray River and across Katarapko Island, I have included artists impression photos below. 2026 will be another very busy year with works expected to commence by April, and completion anticipated by the end of March 2027.





A big thankyou to retiring Board Member Robert Fielke for his 10 years service on the Riverview Board, as both a board member and as Chairperson, his governance experience and leadership skills were a great asset to our organisation. Robert's structured and planned succession to our new Chairperson Sam Hentschke ensured a smooth and supported transition and was most appreciated.

We are looking forward to the exciting changes in 2026 and feel extremely blessed to have received the funding required to assist us with building this fabulous new extension for the benefit of existing residents and to also provide a much needed home for an addition 22 elderly people.

Stephen is on-site until lunchtime and is available to answer any medication questions relating to our residents. He can help explain prescriptions, discuss medication purposes, or side effects, and assist with reviewing residents' medication regimes to ensure everything remains safe and appropriate.

Please remember that Stephen's role is focused on resident care only, so he is unable to provide advice about personal or non-resident medications.

We're delighted to have Steve as part of our team. Be sure to say hello or speak with him during his Wednesday visits!
